Advent is a season of endings and beginnings. As the calendar year prepares to end, a new church year begins. Jesus' birth ushers us into new ways of living and loving; and yet, the world as we know it spins madly on with violence, destruction and death. In many ways, pregnant Mary was surrounded by endings. They were large and small, personal and political. Still, Mary proclaimed hope in a God who was and is making all things new. Jesus' birth offered a beautiful new beginning for shepherds and Magi alike. All the while, King Herod tried to bring Jesus' story to an end before it can truly begin. When we ourselves navigate seasons filled with endings and beginnings, we need reminders. We need words that can feel like steady ground, like a path for our feet to find as we step forward into the unknown.

During the seasons of Advent, Christmas, and Epiphany, we will again use devotional materials created by *A Sanctified Art.* The theme this year is "*Words for the Beginning: Advent reminders for new seasons.*" This devotional is shaped around several reminders we all need from time to time: you are a blessing; we can't go alone; do the good that is yours to do; hope is worth the risk; love knows your name; don't forget to laugh; the road isn't straight. These reminders root us in the fundamental truths of our faith. Many of them are life lessons we teach to children, lessons that adults continue to learn and relearn. They may resemble the blessings we impart to loved ones during special ceremonies like weddings or baptisms. I invite you to move through this Advent season as if you are entering a sacred new chapter, holding fast to the reminders that will bolster you for the journey ahead.

Printed devotional booklets are available. Electronic versions will be sent out to those who request them. For those of you who can, I encourage you to do the electronic version to save paper. As we have done recently, I ask that you consider donating to offset the \$144 cost of the resource (this isn't in the church's budget). Whether you can make a donation or not, I hope you will use the devotional daily. Read, look, and sing your way through the pages of this devotional. Each week offers art, reflections, poetry, and hymns to give you strength, courage, and grace. As you journey through this season, may you find words for beloved ness and hope. May you find words for beginning again. For no matter what you are facing, no matter what this new day brings, remember that love is your beginning.

Finance Committee Report: Non-Profit Application: There was discussion at the Finance Meeting around turning RLC into a food pantry only. There is a need for someone to research the process of applying for 501-c3 status.

The next meeting is December 8, 2024. We closed by reciting our Mission Statement and the Lord's Prayer.

In October the food pantry served 120 families which consisted of 255 adults and 97 children. We welcomed 13 new guests. We received 53 donations from our members, companies and others in October. It is so nice to see how many guests want to pray with us before we open.

We are so grateful for our volunteers. We have 24 volunteers of which 4 are not members of Resurrection. Financial Summary October 2024

October Year to Date Income: \$5,847.21 \$69,348.35 Expenses: (\$12,077.39) (\$120,908.50) Income Shortfall: (\$6,230.18) (\$51,560.15)

October results show a gain in our investments of \$390.79. Envelope income was under budget by (\$1,612.33) for the month & under budget (\$6,570.78) for the year. Expenses were under budget by \$427.03 for the month, & under budget by \$4,135.70 for the year. Our cash position as of 10/31/24 is \$123,879.14 in total cash assets, spread across our Money Market Fund, CD, and Checking Account. Our envelope giving year to date is behind budget and hopefully we can make up for this shortfall in the last Quarter of the year. Year to date we have taken \$32,500.00 out of the Money Market fund. If this continues, we will have no more money in this fund in the next 12 months. We are looking at ways to generate more income going forward. If you are behind in your envelope giving, now is the time to catch up. If you are current on your giving, please consider increasing your giving if possible.
