Serving Our Neighbors by Sharing Our Blessings!

As we near a new church (liturgical) year, we come to the end of this series of articles looking at how to help neighbors feel welcome the first time they visit RLC. I started off asking for the congregation's help in figuring out where RLC is right now. Sadly, only a handful of people responded. But that's not stopping us. We're going to move ahead as best as we can even if people don't respond. Now, here's my blunt statement: If you're not going to provide input when asked, don't complain when things change.

Next, we looked at building a great website. Many thanks to Wayne M. for taking that seriously and gathering a Media Ministry Team. Half of the team are not members or regular attendees. Yet they have been committed to redesigning the website and upping RLC's social media presence. It's not finished, but it is a whole lot better than it was. Thanks to Phillip M. and Yurail M. for all their hard work!

In June I looked at what we need to do better once people walk into the church. Having a clearly identifiable Welcome Center is key. Some nice changes were made to the table we keep the bulletins on. It still isn't a Welcome Center. We should also point people in the right direction. I believe folks are doing better with this. The most important thing in that article was that every member of RLC needs to think of themselves as part of the Welcome Team. I've seen many who have taken that seriously. Thank you! I went to a bonus topic in July's article: 5 common sense tips for welcoming our neighbors. I want to thank everyone who has taken that seriously, especially #3: Introduce yourself. I've seen a drastic change at Resurrection, from one or two people introducing themselves to just about everyone doing so on Reformation Sunday. To all who introduce themselves to our guest that day by saying your name first, thank you, thank you, thank you!

Last month I mentioned how wonderful it was to receive a welcome gift at a couple of the churches I visited over the summer. It is something we can do as well with a simple gift. We're still working on that. Thanks to Walter J. for providing a couple of inexpensive options.

This last point is possibly the hardest one to implement: designing the service around new people. We're used to the service being designed around what we like, and many of us have been in church all our lives. The problem is that for someone visiting, who most likely hasn't grown up in church, what we've done for decades makes no sense to them. Part of the challenge is figuring out which parts of the service are easily understood, and which are traditions that mean nothing to new people. The service should lift everyone, not just the few. Part of it is readjusting our thinking about who church is for. Doing that requires change. Changes you will (or have) seen in worship include: 1) a welcome speech (not done by me); 2) preaching; 3) an offering statement that lets guests know they shouldn't feel obligated to give; 4) next steps (at the end of service).

Changes are coming to worship. I invite you to share with me one part of worship you'd hate to see change <u>and</u> why it's so important to you.

Financial Summary September 2024

September Year to Date Income: \$6,392.59 \$63,501.14 Expenses: (\$12,413.97) (\$108,831.11) Income Shortfall: (\$6,021.38) (\$45,329.97)

September results show a gain in our investments of \$416.33. Envelope income was under budget by (\$1,143.33) for the month & under budget (\$4,958.45) for the year. Expenses were under budget by \$90.45 for the month, & under budget by \$3,708.64 for the year. Our cash position as of 9/30/24 is \$130,283.34 in total cash assets, spread across our Money Market Fund, CD, and Checking Account. Our envelope giving year to date is behind budget and hopefully we can make up for this shortfall in the last Quarter of the year. Year to date we have taken \$32,500.00 out of this fund. If this continues, we will have no more money in this fund in the next 12 months. We will have a meeting after church on November 3rd to discuss our current financial situation and our options for moving forward.
